## BONE MEAL IS AN INDISPENSABLE SOIL AMENDMENT EVERY GARDENER SHOULD HAVE ON HAND



## THE FACTS

Bone meal supplies high levels of phosphorus and calcium.

Phosphorus and calcium are required for plant growth, **BUT** both (especially phosphorus) can cause problems if they occur in high concentrations.

- Phosphorus and calcium are RARELY LACKING in non-agricultural soils.
- High levels of phosphorus INHIBIT GROWTH
  of mycorrhizal fungi, causing the plant to put
  additional resources into root growth AT THE
  EXPENSE of other tissues and functions.
- Excess phosphorus can contaminate groundwater.
